

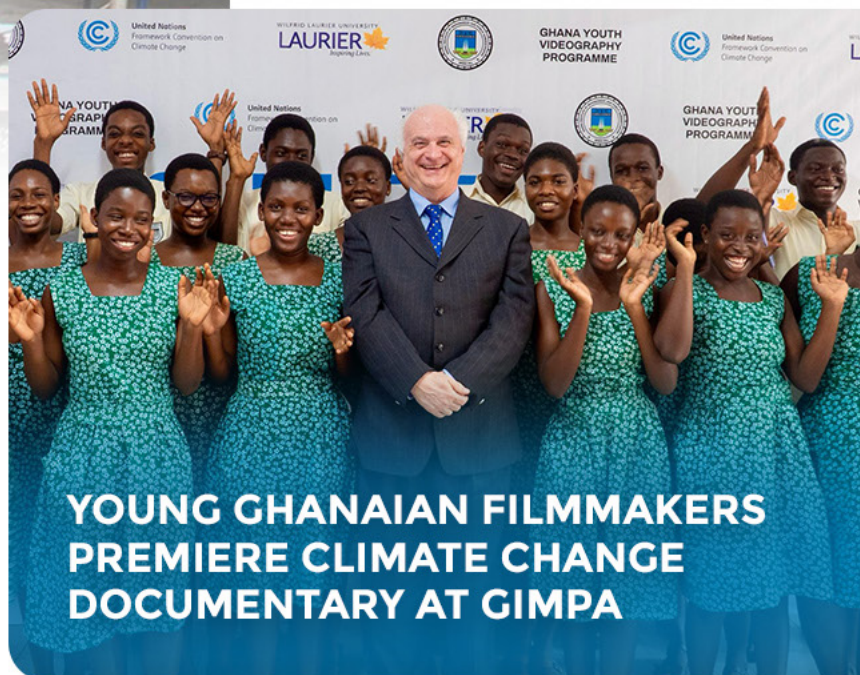

YOUNG GHANAIAAN FILMMAKERS PREMIERE CLIMATE CHANGE DOCUMENTARY AT GIMPA

The Ghana Institute of Management and Public Administration (GIMPA), in collaboration with Wilfrid Laurier University in Canada and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, hosted a special screening of a climate change documentary on February 20, 2025.

Produced by participants of the Ghana Youth Videography Programme (GYVP), the documentary highlights the impact of climate change on agriculture, ecosystems, and livelihoods in Ghana.



The initiative equips young Ghanaians with videography skills to effectively communicate environmental issues through compelling storytelling.

Speaking at the event, **Prof. Obeng Acquah, Dean of the GIMPA Business School**, emphasized the urgency of addressing climate change, noting that the documentary serves as a powerful tool for awareness and policy discussions. **Dr. Magnus Mfofo-M'Carthy, Co-Lead of GYVP**, called for stronger action against environmental degradation, particularly illegal mining, while **Professor Mark Terry of York University** commended the film as vital evidence for policymakers.

The screening engaged stakeholders in discussions on climate action, reinforcing the role of youth in advocating for environmental sustainability.



GIMPA HOCKEY QUEENS SUFFER LAST-GASP DEFEAT TO SELECT PROFESSIONAL SIDE IN A FRIENDLY MATCH

Diki's 70th minute strike from a well-executed corner kick sealed victory for the International Select side on Saturday, 22nd February, 2025.
