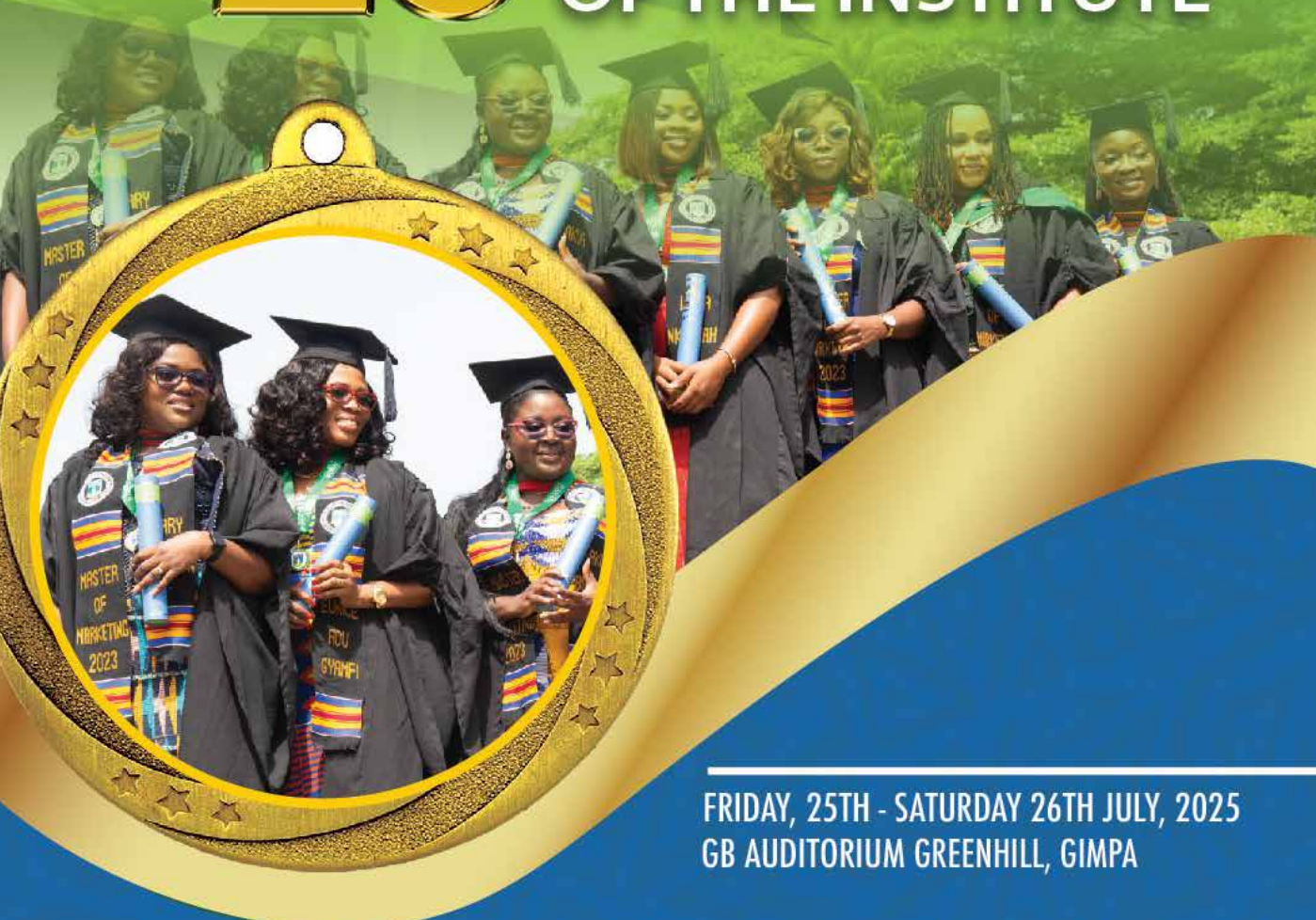

## PROFILE OF SPECIAL GUEST

### HON. JOHN DUMELO

**H**onourable John Dumelo is a Ghanaian politician, entrepreneur, agribusiness leader, and renowned creative arts advocate. He currently serves as the Member of Parliament for the Ayawaso West Wuogon Constituency and the Deputy Minister for Food and Agriculture. Appointed in March 2025, he is at the forefront of Ghana's efforts to strengthen food security, modernize agriculture, and expand employment opportunities, particularly for the youth.

Hon. Dumelo's foray into agriculture began in 2012, and he has since developed over 2,000 acres of farmland across Ghana. His agribusiness operations span a range of produce - including maize, rice, ginger, and cabbage - and incorporate livestock production, poultry, and snail farming. This extensive hands-on experience forms the backbone of his commitment to transforming Ghana's agricultural landscape and creating inclusive agribusiness opportunities for young people.

In his capacity as Deputy Minister, he has been instrumental in launching and driving major initiatives such as the

Feed Ghana Programme, a flagship national strategy aimed at increasing domestic food production and improving livelihoods. He also spearheaded the establishment of the Amankwakrom Cattle Ranch Taskforce in the Afram Plains, a bold step toward enhancing livestock management and pasture development in Ghana's hinterlands.

Beyond agriculture, Hon. Dumelo is a passionate and longstanding advocate for the creative arts industry. He is a celebrated figure in the film and entertainment sector, having received multiple awards in recognition of his contributions. Over the years, he has actively participated in numerous global forums and conferences focused on the development of Africa's creative economy. He has championed policies, regulatory reforms, and social interventions aimed at strengthening the creative arts ecosystem in Ghana and across the continent. His voice continues to shape the industry's evolving narrative, particularly on matters of intellectual property, funding, and infrastructure for the arts. Despite his strong presence in this space, his deep-rooted love for agriculture re-





mains central to his national service.

Academically, Hon. Dumelo holds a Bachelor of Science in Public Administration and a Master of Governance and Leadership (MGL) GIMPA. He further obtained a Master of Laws (LL.M.) in Natural Resources Law from the University of Ghana, specializing in legal frameworks for land, water, and extractive resource governance - areas deeply relevant to

both agriculture and environmental policy.

Hon. Dumelo is known for his humility, philanthropy, and unwavering dedication to national development. He is married with children and continues to use his platform to advocate for innovation, inclusion, and sustainable growth across sectors.

## PROFILE OF SPECIAL GUEST

### KWAW ANSAH

In his native Ghana, Kwaw Panyintsir Ansah is the ultimate reference point in filmmaking. In his motherland Africa, he is one of the continent's leading names in the mass communication industry. In between, he is a colossus straddling culture, creative arts and advertising.

He was born on 17th July, 1941 at Swedru in the Central part of Ghana. He attained his GCE O LEVELS in 1960, at the same time working as a textile designer for UAC (United African Company).

Since his return to Ghana after attending Regent Street Polytechnic London, (1961 to 1963) for theater design and the American Academy of Dramatic Arts (1963- 1965) for Dramatic Arts, everything that has engaged his mind or which his hands have touched has earned him the ultimate applause of industry – a Living Legend.

Famous textile designs like 'ABANKABA' and 'YOU TOO CAN FLY', television commercials such as 'Signal', 'omo' and 'lux soap', (1967) which topped competing brands on the market in the 60s through 70s bear the signature of Kwaw Ansah, though he created them for his employ-

er, UAC (now Unilever). Commercials like 'GOIL', 'Chocolate Spread', 'The Lotto Agent', among numerous others, produced for his own agency, Target Saatchi and Saatchi, swept industry awards in their respective years of production. At the global level, his 'ABC Beer' commercial won the prestigious CLIO New York Awards in 1989, the first African TVC to be so recognized. To top them all, his peers on the Advertising Association of Ghana conferred on him the club's highest honour, Outstanding Personality Award (2003).

THEATER- Kwaw Ansah's second stage play, "MOTHERS TEARS", (1968) was performed in the Drama studio, National theater and other places including Legon featured some of the Pioneer performing Artistes like, Middlethon Mens, Sandy Arkhurst, Mary Yirenkyi, Omar Hunter, Dzifa Glikpoeyi, Martin Owusu etc, became a play performed in various tertiary institutions in the country.

But it is in the film industry that Ansah cements his reputation as the unrivalled craftsman. Masterfully crafted flagship movies, namely the groundbreaking 'Love Brewed in the African Pot', 'Heri-





tage Africa' and the documentary, 'Cross Roads of People Cross Roads of Trade', created for his Film Africa Limited, defined Ghana's film industry in the 70s, 80s and 90s. In Ghana, they are still the standard by which all others are measured. Throughout the film world, these productions took the industry by storm, earning him several national, global and professional awards.

'Love Brewed' won numerous awards, including:

- (i) The Jury Prize for Best Director at the 1981 version of FESPACO, the most highly recognized Pan African Film Festival
- (ii) 8th International Film Festival of India (1981), Jury's Special Silver Peacock Award was the first African film to have attracted such laurels in the festival's eight-year history, where the film was awarded "For a Genuine and Talented Attempt to Find a National and Culture Identity"
- (iii) The OAU Prize for Heritage Africa. It was the African Union's first ever award for film.
- (iv) The Order of the Nation of Burkina Faso (March 1995) for Arts & Culture.
- (v) The Grand Medal of Ghana (2000)
- (vi) The Prestigious Millenium Excel-

lent Award for Arts was won by Kwaw Ansah in 2005, having the King of Ashanti as the principal patron.

- (vii) The First Awardee of National Film and Television Institute (NAFTI), 'Akofena Award' (for pioneering spirit in forging the development of the Media in Ghana- not only as an independent Film Producer, but also as an initiator of quality Advertising and Television in the country. For your professional excellence as a Story teller, Director and Producer par-non in Ghana 2011).

When his next feature, 'Heritage Africa', won the Yenenga Grand Prix at the 1989 FESPACO, it was the first film from anglophone Africa to have topped the list in any FESPACO awards event.

At the London Film Festival (1989) Heritage Africa was selected as the "Outstanding Film of the Year" and the first African Film to be featured. Adopted by the state, the government of Ghana made it as a policy to screen 'Heritage' to every visiting pan-Africanist-oriented delegation to Ghana.

The international documentary, 'Crossroads of People, Crossroads of Trade' (1994) which he made for the Ghana





Museum and Monuments Board and sponsored by the Smithsonian Institution, won the Fespaco Documentary Film Award.

In 1998, Ansah was awarded the Arts, Critics and Reviewers Association of Ghana (ACRAG) Prize, the Living Legend Award for contribution to the Arts of Ghana

Since then, Ansah has produced other films, including *Harvest at 17* (1994), and *'The Golden Stool, Soul of the Asantes'* (2000).

To all of the above, he has added to his filmography, classics shot on the video format, including *'The Love of AA'*, *'Papa Lasisi Good Bicycle'*, *'Suffering to Lose'* and *'Praising The Lord Plus One'*.

At the First National Film and Television Institute (NAFTI) Film Lectures in 2011 on the Ghanaian Motion Picture Indus-

try, the Legend was honoured for his unmatched contribution to cinema. During that same event, he was given the Osagyefo Lifetime Achievement Award by the Ghana Academy of Film and Television Arts (GAFTA) and in 2014. He was among 14 eminent Africans who won the Osagyefo Kwame Nkrumah African Genius Award for Lifetime Achievement. At the continental level, Ansah's chairmanship (1995) of the Federation of African Film Makers (FEPACI), was an affirmation by this grouping of Africa's film legends, its appreciation of Ansah's single-minded vision to use the craft to tell Africa's story. As chairman of the FEPACI Film Congress, Mr. Ansah declared that the goal of African Film Makers' should not be achieving Francophone, Anglophone, Lusophone excellence but Film Africaphone.

## PROFILE OF SPECIAL GUEST

### MS. WIYAALA NOELLA NWADEI

Wiyaala, meaning "the doer" is a singer songwriter from the Upper West Region of Ghana. Singing in Sissala, Waale, Dagaare and English, she blends language to create a unique AfroFolk sound whilst combining her vocals with guitar, calabash and contemporary electronic instruments.

Raised in Funsì, she began performing at five, guided by her mother, a chorister at the local church.

Wiyaala gained national fame after winning Ghana's 2012 Vodafone Icons Reality Show. Her albums include Wiyaala (2014), Sissala Goddess (2018), and African Polyglot (2024) with "Segeberige" due for release in October 2025. An advocate for chil-

dren's rights and female empowerment she has worked with UNICEF Ghana, often addressing exploitation through her lyrics. Wiyaala designs her stage outfits to honour northern Ghana's traditions and has built an arts centre, community radio station, guest house and restaurant in Funsì.

Wiyaala, a member of The Recording Academy, has won many awards and has represented Ghana across five continents including performances at The Commonwealth Games 2018 in Australia and for the former USA Vice-president, Kamala Harris. In 2024, she was included in BBC's 100 Women's list of inspiring and influential women."





## PROFILE OF GIMPA

The Ghana Institute of Management and Public Administration (GIMPA) was established in 1961 as a joint Ghana government/United Nations Special Fund Project as the Institute of Public Administration (IPA) to develop the public administrative systems and to produce civil servants with the administrative and professional competence to plan and administer national, regional, and local services.

Over the past years, GIMPA's activities have been guided by five successive mandates from the first Legislative Instrument of 1961 to the current GIMPA Act 2004 (Act 676). Each one of them has affirmed the vision of the founders to be a leading national and international Management Development Institute. The mandates progressively expanded the Institute's scope of business to reflect the manpower needs relevant to national development.

The GIMPA Act of 2004 (Act 676) estab-

lished GIMPA as a Chartered Public Tertiary Institute with a mandate to award certificates, diplomas and degrees up to PhD. level. GIMPA now offers education, training and services in the fields of leadership, management, public administration, technology, law and other humanities disciplines for the public sector, private sector and NGOs.

GIMPA operates under a Governing Council appointed by the President of the Republic of Ghana in accordance with Article 70 of the 1992 Constitution.

Currently, GIMPA has five (5) Schools, namely:

- School of Public Service and Governance
- Business School
- School of Technology and Social Sciences
- School of Graduate Studies and Research
- GIMPA Law School

**Trustworthiness:** puts us under duty to be honest, truthful and relied upon in all our engagements.

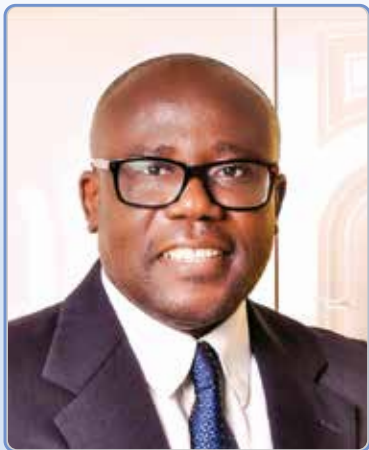

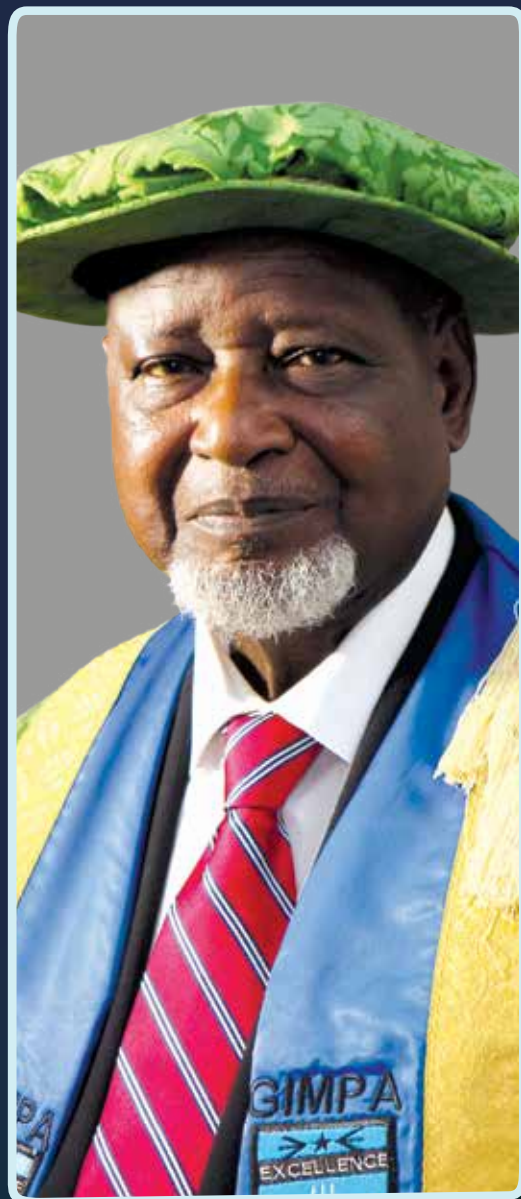

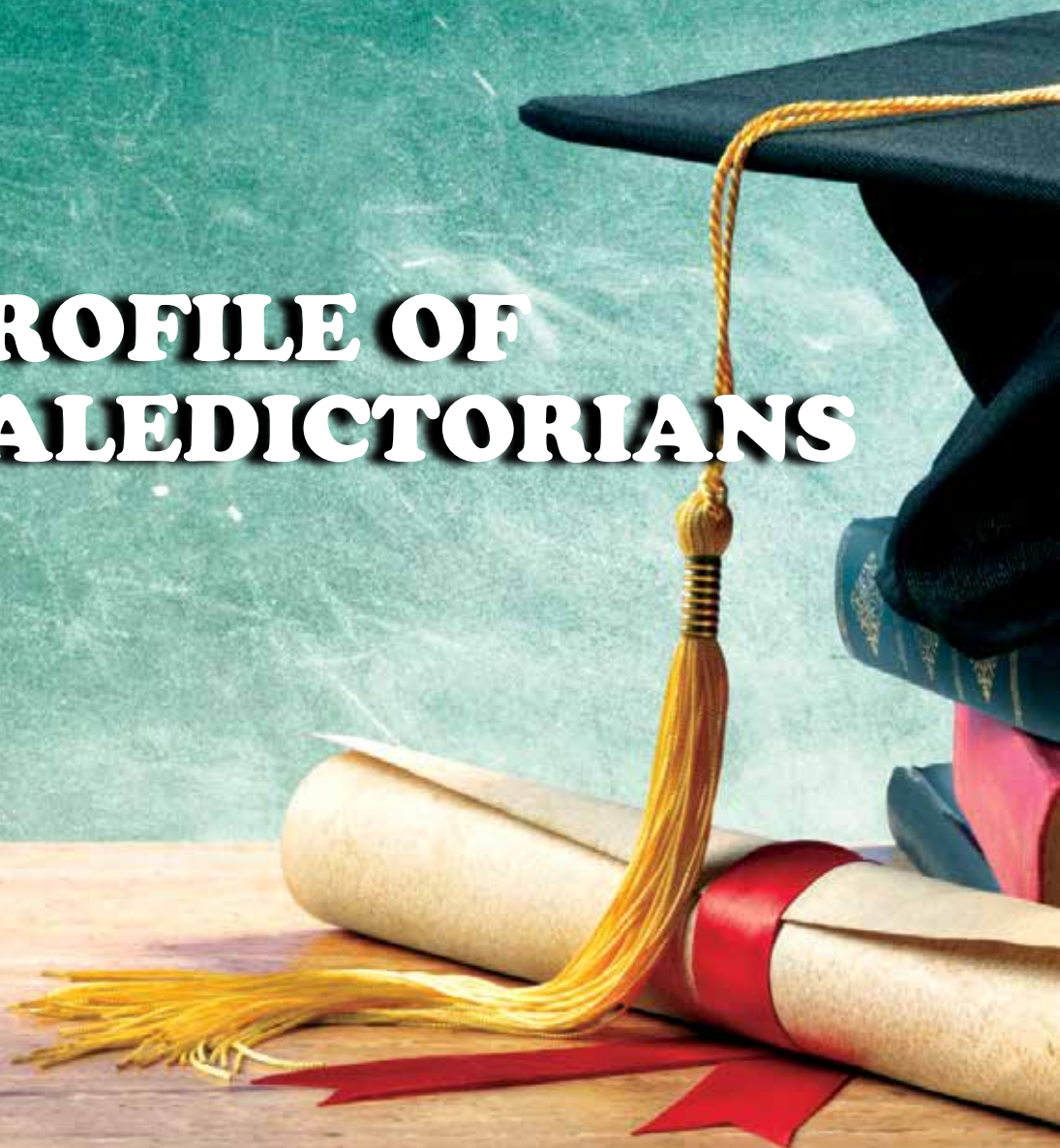

With over 13 years of legal experience, including 10 years on the bench, she has earned a reputation as a fair-minded, diligent, and principled jurist. She is an old Achimotan belonging to the Akora 2002 year group.

She began her legal career in private practice, gaining valuable experience at Fugar and Company and the Legal Assistance Network of Ghana. In 2015, she was appointed Magistrate of the Teshie-Nungua District Court. She has since 2020 served at the Adentan Circuit Court and is currently the presiding Judge at the Accra Circuit Court. Academically, she holds an LL.B from KNUST and was called to the Ghana Bar in 2012, receiving the Best Student award in the Law of Evidence.
